We serve as a unified voice for the European lighting industry and a platform of collaboration for all stakeholders across the value chain to align industry aspirations and European policy goals.







## Taking SMEs by the hand: LightingEurope's Webinar on EPREL

- Implementing Regulation (EU) 2024/994 lays down the operational details of EPREL with the aim of ensuring the quality, reliability of the information provided to consumers & public authorities via the database.
- Supplier verification will be mandatory from 22 October 2024.
- LightingEurope hosted the European Commission for a live demonstration of how to upload products and go through the supplier verification process on the EPREL database according to the latest novelties introduced by the Regulation.





## LightingEurope's public statement on Taxonomy (March '24)

- Lack of clarity on the classification of the manufacturing of all lighting products in EU Taxonomy.
- Calling for inclusion of manufacturing of luminaires as a whole in the EU Taxonomy as enabling activity.
- LightingEurope's efforts to clarify the situation, also in view of a possible future amendment of the legislative act.

#### LightingEurope's Statement on EU Taxonomy

#### Classification of luminaire manufacturing

The EU Taxonomy is a green classification system that translates the EU's climate and environmental objectives into criteria for specific economic activities, for investment purposes.

In its current version, the Delegated Act of the EU Taxonomy which establishes the Technical Screening Criteria (TSC) for determining when an economic activity qualifies as contributing substantially to climate change mitigation or climate change adaptation overs manufacturing of lighting products in activity "3.5. Manufacture of energy efficiency equipment for buildings". Specifically, in this section the manufacturing of light sources and of presence and daylight controls for lighting systems are expressly mentioned among the economic activities elicible for Taxonomy

The current wording in the Regulation, as described above, does not provide full clarity on the classification of the manufacturing of all lighting products in the EU Taxonomy for climate change mitigation and adaptation purposes, which has created some uncertainty in the market

LightingEurope believes that it would be beneficial if manufacturing of luminaires as a whole would also be explicitly mentioned as an enabling activity for Taxonomy climate change mitigation and adaptation, with relevant and specific Technical Screening Criteria.

For this reason, LightingEurope is working to help clarifying the wording of the activity definitions, including the Technical Screening Criteria, in view of a possible future amendment of the legislative act.

- 1. legislative proposal on Substantiating Green Claims on substances of concern
- 2. legislative proposal on Packaging and Packaging Waste on the empty ratio packaging for electronics
- 3. legislative proposal on Construction Products regulation, clarifying that lighting excluded from the current scope
- 4. position of the European Parliament on the EPBD, with a definition of indoor environmental quality that includes lighting and the mandate of automatic lighting controls in non-residential buildings

## PSR, LCA, PEP Ecopassport

- PEP association contributed to revision of PEP PSR 0014 luminaires for general lighting
- Published in July 2023 and publicly available
- Outreach to IBU Berlin, EPD Italy and Aenor
- Encourage alignment on methodologies across Europe
- Collaboration at global level Global Lighting
   Association (GLA) White Paper published July 24
- Outreach to specifiers and GreenLight Alliance
- Collaboration with UK TM 66 the LIA
- LE is finalising discussions on PSR rules for components (e.g. control gears)
- LE kicked off internal work on light sources





## Asking enforcement of rules for level playing field and fair market conditions



Better enforcement in online marketplaces – Joint

statement Sept 2024

- 59 co-signatories organisations in a coalition led by LightingEurope
- Several legislative options to regulate the problem of lack of liability of online marketplaces
- Ongoing outreach to Commission's cabinets and MEPs
- Parliamentary dinner debate on 4 December organized by LE

Joint Statement - European stakeholders united for a level playing field for online marketplaces and effective enforcement





## Online mystery shopper – 2023 + 2024 coming soon



- 71% of the lighting products that we checked online did not comply with EU mandatory information requirements.
- 95% of the products that were physically inspected are noncompliant with EU mandatory information requirements.
