Postponement of Light+Building 2020

LightingEurope commends and fully supports Messe Frankfurt and all the stakeholders involved on taking what must have been a difficult but brave decision to postpone Light+Building to the second half of September 2020.

Light+Building is an essential platform for the lighting industry, LightingEurope remains committed to the trade show and we look forward to catching up with our partners and friends in September. LightingEurope will announce new details about our presence and our event at Light+Building once more information becomes available.

For our event scheduled 10th March, we had confirmed 2 representatives of the European Commission and 1 national market surveillance authority and were planning to deliver a detailed overview of how recent and upcoming EU policies and rules impact the global lighting industry and what is being done to swiftly remove non-compliant products from the EU market.
